

**Harvey Broome Papers
McClung Historical Collection**

Harvey Benjamin Broome (July 15, 1902 - March 8, 1968) was born in Knoxville, Tennessee. He was a lawyer, conservationist, and a writer. Harvey was a founding member of the Wilderness Society, serving as president from 1957 to 1968, He was a great supporter of the Great Smoky Mountains National Park and was an active member of numerous organizations. His widow, Anne Broome (Anna Pursel Broome), was Harvey's biggest admirer and she wrote the following biographical sketch of Harvey, which appeared in An Encyclopedia of East Tennessee, edited by Jim Stokely and Jeff D. Johnson (Oak Ridge, TN: 1981.)

Harvey Broome (July 15, 1902 - March 8, 1968). From Ireland in the 1770's came John Adair and his family to East Tennessee. Adair was a public entry-taker who collected money for the sale of lands. He relied on his conscience during the American Revolution to justify turning over public monies, without authorization, to finance the battle of Kings Mountain. From England in the 1870's came George Broome and his family to East Tennessee. Broome, a wheelwright and carpenter, was a tenant who had been evicted by his landlord for doing what he thought "every Englishman had a right to do, vote according to the dictate of his own conscience."

Harvey Benjamin Broome, a fifth-generation descendant of his maternal ancestor John Adair, and a third-generation descendant of his paternal ancestor George Broome, was born in KNOXVILLE. He graduated from THE UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE and from Harvard Law School. In 1935, with seven other persons, he organized The Wilderness Society. From 1948 to 1968, he was a trustee for the Robert Marshall Wilderness Fund. He served as president, at various periods, of The Wilderness Society, the Smoky Mountains Hiking Club, and the East Tennessee Historical Society. It has been written that the law was Harvey Broome's way of making a living, but wilderness was his way of life. The latter way was opened to him in 1917 when he accompanied three uncles on a

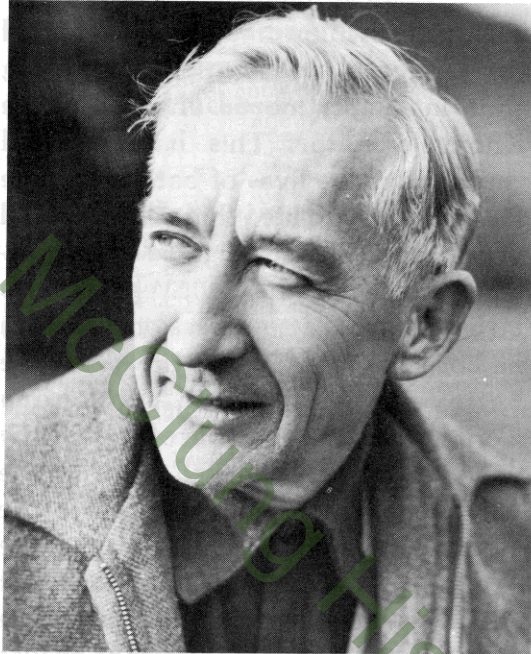
two-week camping trip to the Great Smoky Mountains. That event began a 50-year hiking career; on his last hike, in November of 1967, he went with a friend to Charlies Bunion in the Smokies. The 1917 camping trip also led to years of outdoor writing and to Harvey Broome's role as a leader in wilderness preservation. His first published writing was an article entitled "Great Smoky Mountain Trails," which appeared in the January 1928 issue of *Mountain Magazine*.

In January of 1941, Harvey conceived a project of keeping a journal in the manner of Henry David Thoreau, whose journals he read with dedication. This concept materialized when he received, in the Christmas mail, a 5" x 8" notebook from a business friend. He filled 26 such notebooks and a portion of the 27th. He did not make notes while hiking; "fact underfoot and thought overhead" had to be carried in his memory until time could be found at home to write. Sometimes this would be the day after a mountain trip; sometimes there would be a lapse of a week or more. These journals, plus a "black notebook" containing thumbnail sketches of his hikes, provided the text for two of his three posthumously published books.

Like Thoreau, Harvey constructed a box to house the journals. Thoreau's chest was handmade of pine and stained brown, with a front hinged at the bottom and a lock at the top. Harvey made his chest of walnut, from a tree on his property. It had a sliding front with thumbnail indentation and was hand-polished with wax.

As president of The Wilderness

Society, Harvey was requested in 1964 to write a letter predicting the status of forest conservation a hundred years hence. He wrote that forests will be pressed for survival against the effects of overuse, forest disease, and air pollutants; that plastics and metals will have largely displaced the structural use of wood; and that the quantity and quality of first-growth trees will have vanished, except in such wilderness preserves as have survived. His letter is to be opened by the President of the United States on October 24, 2064.

With his heritage of conscience, his love of nature, and his power of articulation, Harvey Broome was deeply spiritual. He had an understanding of human relationships and human values. His faith, he wrote, was in life itself.

Parson Brownlow, William Gannaway Brownlow (August 29, 1805 - 1877), son of Joseph Brown and Catherine Gannaway Brownlow, born in Wythe County, Virginia. Following the War of 1812, he moved from Virginia to Blount County, Tennessee. His parents died in 1813 and he was raised by his maternal relatives. William was the paternal uncle and later of Abingdon, Virginia, as a newspaper apprentice. During a Methodist meeting, young Brownlow and

burning desire to see the state consumed by fire. Early in 1837, he was vitriol exposed to the public. He appear in print and he was promptly sued for libel, a case to which he quickly became the loser. By 1839 he was publishing the *Tennessee Whig* in ELIZABETHTON, a very politically biased, scathingly pious, and described by peers as "dull, vapid and without a singularly redeeming feature." This description, however, did not last, as Brownlow's political leanings and his diatribes

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In his will, Harvey Broome left his papers and library to the McClung Historical Collection, a department of the Knox County Public Library System in Knoxville, Tennessee. Anne Broome donated additional papers, correspondence and writings.

The first four boxes contain Harvey Broome's original, handwritten journals dating from 1941 to 1968. These were deemed by Harvey's widow Anne to be so precious that they were kept in a bank safety deposit box. The following 51 boxes contain the files from the filing cabinets in the Broome home, in Knoxville, and together the 55 boxes make up the core of the Harvey Broome Papers. The arrangement of the collection generally follows the order in which Harvey and Anne Broome kept the material. The subject headings they used on their folders were copied, with some small changes for clarification. If a somewhat unusual original heading was retained it was quoted directly from the original file label and indicated by quotation marks. 'See' and 'see also' references were added to assist the researcher in locating material. Most of the folder contents are in reverse chronological order, with the most recent information appearing at the beginning of the folder and the oldest material at the back, which was the way the Broomes kept their files. In addition to folders on individuals or specific subjects, the Broomes had folders labeled just "A", "B", "C", etc., that contain mixed materials, usually correspondence, without enough material on each person or subject to justify having its own folder. Anne Broome was active for many years after the death of Harvey Broome in 1968 and some of the folders contain only her correspondence and material

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The first 55 boxes of the Harvey Broome Papers make up the main part of the collection, containing his journals and the papers kept in filing cabinets in the Broome library at home. Additional material includes photographs, slides, publications, and additional writings and correspondence. As this material is processed it will be in Boxes 56 and higher and added to this listing.
